INTRODUCTION

This Partners' Report shares results from the 2023 International Overdose Awareness Day (IOAD) campaign. IOAD 2023 was a multifaceted, global campaign to create awareness and understanding around the prevalence of drug overdose, the urgency for reform and to empower positive change in the field of drug policy.

More than 1,000 people shared their insights and ideas with us. These important insights will help shape future campaigns.

It is not enough to deliver campaigns. We need to know whether our work is effective, whether it reaches the right audience and how we can improve what we do.

The results of our evaluation are detailed in this report. Drawn from several sources, including digital marketing tools, social media analytics, and our 2023 Community Survey, this report tracks the growing impact of our annual campaign, highlights key outcomes and successes from 2023, and showcases specific IOAD events held by our global partners. It tracks campaign impact, quantifies strategic actions and documents the perceptions of our community partners.

More than 1,000 people shared their insights and ideas with us to enable this report – including email subscribers, our many wonderful supporters, partners and those who responded through social media.

Understanding how communities around the world engage with IOAD helps us shape future campaigns more effectively and enables us to track the campaign's impact year on year.

It's also critical to the success of the IOAD campaign that our partners get to see the collective impact of their actions. Whether it's sharing a campaign message on social media, hosting an event, learning how to respond to an overdose, or meeting local decision- makers to talk about overdose prevention strategies, each action contributes to the impact of our common goals.

This report is a measure of the success of IOAD, due in large part to your support. As this report demonstrates, your feedback and ongoing commitment to this vital campaign is and has been incredibly valuable – *thank you*.

OUR APPROACH

There can be no doubt that overdose is a global health catastrophe.

Over the past two decades, drug overdose deaths have risen dramatically in many parts of the world.

Behind the statistics of this escalating crisis is the devastating human tragedy of loss and suffering.

More than 100,000 Americans die from overdose every year while in Australia, drug overdose is now the second leading cause of death for people aged 30-39.

Evidence-based responses and positive change is now more urgent than ever.

Our vision is of a world in which:

- Overdose is recognised and tackled as a global health crisis.
- Communities understand overdose prevention and see overdose as a critical health issue.
- People who use drugs are supported and socially connected.

Our approach focuses on activating communities around the world to raise awareness of the crisis and advocate for evidence-based overdose prevention and drug policy.

OUR (AMPAIGN

We work towards a world free of drug overdose through International Overdose Awareness Day (IOAD) - the world's largest campaign to end overdose.

First held in Melbourne, Australia in 2001, IOAD has been convened globally by Penington Institute since 2012 and is now observed by communities in more than 40 countries worldwide.

Held on August 31 each year, this global day of action and advocacy remembers those who have died and acknowledges the profound grief of those left behind.

It raises awareness about this global epidemic and campaigns for urgent evidence-based action on overdose prevention and drug policy.

It also supports families and communities, and works to break down the stigma surrounding drug use and overdose.

The not-for-profit Penington Institute champions an evidencebased and compassionate approach to building and sharing knowledge to reduce drug-related harm. IOAD is part of that work.

OUR GOALS

The scale and tragedy of the global overdose epidemic demands bold and urgent global action.

Our IOAD campaign goals reflect that ambitionby aiming to:

- Provide accessible information about overdose response and prevention.
- Expand IOAD as a forum for open community discussion about overdose.
- Support the community to advocate for evidence-based policies and practices to prevent overdose.
- Encourage policy-makers to consider evidence-based policies and practices.
- Educate people about evidence-based strategies and initiatives that prevent overdose.

EVENT OBJECTIVES:

To raise awareness of the drug poisoning crisis and to share a safe space for those who are grieving the loss of a loved one.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- Nearly 600 people attended this event.
- The event was supported by food trucks, live music, and Indigenous performances.
- Naloxone training was provided.
- Attendees reported that it was a wonderful evening filled with fellowship and remembrance.

This year, we introduced a theme to IOAD: "Recognizing those people who go unseen." We were pleased to see that the IOAD community around the world rallied behind this theme, acknowledging people in their communities who have been affected by overdose, but might have gone unseen in the crisis. The community honoured family and friends grieving the loss of a loved one; workers in harm reduction, healthcare and other support services; first responders to overdose, and many more. The response to this theme was so strong that we will continue to highlight a new theme each year which offers the community a new angle or idea from which to base their awareness and advocacy efforts.

The campaign theme was used by the community as an event theme, on printed collateral, and on social media posts using the hashtag #weseeyou, alongside our regular campaign hashtags #IOAD23, #IOAD2023, #endoverdose.





This statement yielded the strongest "agree" response in the Community Survey, confirming that one of the campaign's key strengths is supporting individuals and communities to talk


about overdose. We know that when we open up these conversations, we are on the path to positive change.

I believe IOAD has helped me to advocate for greater awareness, policy change or resources in relation to overdose.




I believe IOAD has helped me to advocate for greater awareness, policy change or resources in relation to overdose

EVENT OBJECTIVES:

To bring people who share the same mission of ending overdose together, give a voice to those impacted by overdose, and raise awareness of this pressing issue.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- More than 50 people gathered in a square in Barcelona near the Barcelona City Council and the Generalitat de Catalunya (Government of Catalonia).
- Speakers included families who have lost loved ones to overdose.

- Many wore t-shirts with the message "In memory of the victims of the war on drugs"
- Organisers handed out white roses and read from this year's manifesto.
- The event was covered by local and national media outlets and on social media.
- Supported by organisations including the Catalan Network of People Who Use Drugs (CATNPUD), Metzineres and Association Reus Som Utils (ARSU).



We are very proud to have built a strong global campaign platform which brings together communities from around the world to raise awareness about the tragedy of overdose, and to advocate for change.


There are many reasons why people join the IOAD campaign.

COUNTRIES INVOLVED IN THE 10A0 2023 (AMPAIGN:




CAMPAIGN PARTICIPATION

The Community Survey reveals the exceptional commitment shown by our global community, with almost half of all respondents having been involved in IOAD for between two and five years.

We always welcome new partners to our campaign, and it's very exciting to see that 38% of survey respondents took part for the first time in 2023.

A special thanks to the 3.7% of IOAD partners who have participated for more than a decade. This dedicated group have created significant progress in raising awareness about the devastation of overdose and the urgent need for change.


How many years have you taken part in IOAD? ('taking part' can be anything from following us on social media to running an event)

In terms of IOAD activities undertaken by our community, the most popular was sharing education or awareness materials. This underlines the central role education plays in building awareness around overdose prevention and changing policy and minds.

Our campaign analysis also confirmed that social media is our most powerful campaign tool, with nearly half of all respondents supporting the campaign online.

This online component is important for inclusivity, allowing people to take part no matter where they live, and will continue to be a priority in future IOAD campaigns.

MONTENEGRIN HARM REDUCTION NETWORK LINK & NGO JUVENATS

PODGORICA, MONTENEGRO







EVENT OBJECTIVES:

To support families who have lost loved ones to overdose, raise awareness about overdose, which remains a societal taboo in Montenegro, and express solidarity with the people who use/inject drugs (PWUD/ID) community.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- Community members affected by overdose gathered with teams from Montenegrin Harm Reduction Network Link and NGO Juvenats to light candles, observe a moment of silence to remember those lost to overdose and express solidarity.
- · With the help of local authorities, Podgorica's

Millenium Bridge was illuminated in purple as a symbol of support for those experiencing the impact of overdose.

- More than 20 people attended and the event was covered by the media, including national news agency PR Centar which produced a story picked up nationally by other outlets.
- Event participants were interviewed for television reports.
- The event has raised awareness of this crucial issue throughout the country.

Our Community Survey results demonstrate that IOAD is a powerful platform from which many people can advocate for changes to policies and practices relating to the overdose epidemic.

More than 15% of respondents undertook formal or organised advocacy work around ending overdose, including:

- · Starting a petition
- · Hosting an IOAD event
- Contacting local decision-makers and elected officials
- Preparing policy platforms
- Awareness raising activities, such as information sharing and training

It was especially impressive that 68% of respondents rated their advocacy efforts as effective or very effective in terms of achieving their advocacy goals.

More than 90% of those who engaged in advocacy this year plan to do so again in 2024 – we look forward to continuing to support these partners in this vital work.

EVENT OBJECTIVES:

The drug overdose crisis in Pakistan has had a devastating impact on local communities, families, and individuals.

The Northwest School of Medicine, Peshawar held this session to educate third-year medical students about overdose prevention.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- The event provided access to evidencebased prevention, intervention, and recovery services.
- Screening of a film about the overdose issue in Pakistan.
- 80 medical students and seven faculty members attended the event.

EVENTS IN 2023

Our Community Survey results show that approximately 60,000 people around the world were engaged in IOAD events – and this is not even counting in the number of people who participated in the hundreds of other unsurveyed events around the world.

Thank you to everyone who is on the 2023 Global Events Map for making this IOAD successful. Next year, we aim to improve this map's functionalities to better reflect the global nature of IOAD and diverse ways the community takes part in this campaign.

The most resonated reason to hold an event was to raise awareness about overdose, followed by to reduce stigma around those affected by overdose.

This suggests that overdose remains an insufficiently discussed and heavily stigmatised topic that the general public tend to have limited understanding of.

Remembrance is, and always will be, an important focus of IOAD, and it's reflected by "commemoration and memorials" the third most chosen reason.



GLOBAL HIGHLIGHTS OF 2023

- In the United States, President Joe Biden tweeted about IOAD on August 31, while the White House announced more than \$450 million in new funding to tackle the overdose epidemic.
- St James's Hospital became the first hospital in Ireland with a pilot initiative to provide free naloxone kits to people at risk of overdose.
- On August 31, Scotland Police confirmed the national roll-out of naloxone was complete, and police have administered naloxone on at least 325 occasions.
- In Victoria, Australia, David Ettershank, Member for Western Metropolitan Melbourne, spoke in parliament about the state government's planned expansion of access to hydromorphone.
- St Louis County in the United States has partnered with all county libraries to make Naloxone freely available.
- Emergent announced over the counter access to the overdose-reversing drug Narcan across the United States from September 2023.
- The Salvation Army held a candlelight vigil in Melbourne to mark IOAD.
- The Cyprus Addiction Treatment Authority (AAEK) and the Nicosia municipality organised central Nicosia's Eleftheria square to be lit up in purple on August 31.
- On IOAD, Skoun Addiction Center shared an updated list of safe hospitals that do not report overdose cases to the police in Lebanon.
- In South Africa, the Deputy Minister of Social Development Mme Hendrietta Bogopane-Zulu in partnership with the Central Drug Authority (CDA) and the South African Network for People Who Use Drugs (SANPUD) commemorated IOAD at JB Marks treatment centre in Potchefstroom, North West province.
